What does a Lunch Monitor do?

Lunch Monitors provide support and assistance to students during lunchtime activities under the direction of the school principal. The Lunch Monitor will oversee students in a variety of settings including the classroom, lunch area, and outside play areas and may be required to conduct a variety of indoor and outdoor games and activities.

What qualifications do I need to become a Lunch Monitor?

The basic requirements are:

1. Experience working with children and/or youth;
2. Valid First Aid/CPR certification considered an asset.

What does a Lunch Monitor get paid and what are the hours of work?

Lunch Monitors are paid \$11.86 per hour plus 4% vacation pay and the work assignment can range from 1 to 2 hours per day depending on the duration of the school's lunch period. Schools employ staff on a full-time, part-time, and on a substitute basis. We also have opportunities to job-share positions, making employment at lunch fit almost any schedule.

Successful applicants who commit to a regular schedule for the school year will be paid at a rate of \$12.76 per hour plus 4% vacation pay.

How can I apply to become a Lunch Monitor?

You will be required to register for an account and create an online resume on our job application system, *Careers at HRSB*, to apply. You may also apply directly to your local school principal by dropping off a resume at your local school. Please ensure your resume includes relevant qualifications and experience.
